We are working to update our records; forms will be posted at the club and can be mailed in or dropped off to the staff and will be collected. A couple of rules to remind everyone of on these busy weekends. There are no dogs, cats, animals or reptiles allowed on Casper Boat Club premises at any time except for traveling to and from a member's boat and only then when controlled by a leash. A member shall be responsible for any "mess" so created by his/her pet. All droppings

must be picked up, bagged and removed from the Club premises. All campers are limited to four (4) days (24-hour period). (Example: arrive Wednesday, June 13 at 4 pm. Departing Sunday, June 17 at 4pm). However, a written request presented to and approved by the Board of Directors, may permit a visit to be extended to seven (7) days (24-hour period). **All requests for extended stay camping must be written and submitted to the Board of Directors a minimum of one week prior to requested dates.**

The Wyoming Game and Fish Department has announced a new initiative to hit aquatic invasive species where it counts aimed at preventing the introduction of Quagga and Zebra mussels to Wyoming waters. Under this program, all watercraft using Wyoming waters will be required to display an annual Aquatic Invasive Species decal (inflatable watercraft 10 feet in length or less are exempt). The department will also conduct surveillance to search for the presence of these organisms in Wyoming's waters. In addition, the department is launching an expanded outreach campaign to further educate boaters about the threat of aquatic invasive species and the new decal requirement.

One last reminder Sheryl asked to remind everyone that if you are planning on coming to lunch or especially dinner, please call and make reservations. It gives them an idea of numbers to cook for and keep things ahead and ready for you when you come in. The staff thanks you.
