Beach Party Concerns Addressed By Board

On July 26th a special Board meeting was held to resolve issues that arose from an incident that took place at the Club Beach Party on July 21st. During the party staff members were notified that an intoxicated non-member had brought alcohol onto the property and was beginning to make threats and create problems at the Beach Party. The security issue raised the awareness of staff and members. Boat Club staff and a member confronted the intoxicated man when he refused to leave the property. The situation escalated when staff and a member trying to resolve the problem got upset with each other about how the situation should be handled. The confrontation between staff and the member warranted the Board to meet to resolve the situation and look at security issues that could be bolstered so that future problems could be handled in a more controlled manner.

At the meeting the Board heard from both parties involved and the situation was resolved. The Board also made it clear that safety protocols should be followed if similar situations arise in the future. If any member is concerned about safety issues they should contact the Club Manager and she will investigate the problem and contact law enforcement officials if needed. The Board also decided to hire a law enforcement official to monitor all future large events put on by the club. The Board made it very clear that the safety of members and staff is a top priority. The event at the Beach Party was unfortunate and the Board has taken actions to ensure future situations are handled by law enforcement officials.
