

CBC RULES & RESTRICTIONS

DOCKS

- A. Docks: Members must stay off all assigned docks unless invited by the assigned boat owner. Members with docks are responsible for the removal of all lines and equipment at the end of the season.
- B. Boating: All State laws, County laws, Coast Guard Regulations and Natrona County Parks Rules shall be adhered to. A boat owner shall be financially responsible for damages caused by careless operation or mooring of his/her boat. Every boat should have a minimum of one fender per ten (10) feet of boat length with the fenders placed in a critically protective position.
- C. Launching: All Boats shall prepare for launching prior to entering the Casper Boat Club ramps. The ramp area is vacated immediately after loading or unloading. Use of ramps for this purpose is a privilege for members only and any guest or visitor shall be charged the fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for the same. There shall be no blocking of the picnic, swimming or Bath house area.

GROUNDS

- A. Club Property: Any property of the Club broken, damaged or lost by the carelessness or negligence of a member or his guest must be promptly paid for by said member. Members shall be held responsible for any such damage incurred by their guest.
- B. Campers, Motor Homes and Trailers: All campers are limited to four (4) days. All campers are required to register at the Clubhouse or with the grounds keeper upon arrival. Any camper requesting an electrical connection must be parked in the RV location where the electrical connection will be made. A charge for the electrical connect will be for the full four (4) days; there will be no prorating. Daisy chaining of electrical connections from one RV to another RV is not allowed. Anyone caught participating in this action will be required to vacate the RV parking space and may be asked to leave the property. RV's may not block any road or any other RV parking space.
- C. Guests and Children:
 - 1) A member may have no more than (10) guests on Club grounds, excluding the Clubhouse, without prior approval of a Flag officer.
 - 2) A member is responsible for the actions of his children and guests. Members leaving children on boats or in the Club area day or night are personally responsible for their behavior and safety. The Board of

Directors may refuse service or admission to the Club to any guest of a member for just cause.

- D. Fueling: The only authorized place to fuel any boat or vehicle is at the fuel dock. The fuel dock has fire extinguishers and spill control equipment in case of accident.
- E. Lost Articles: The Casper Boat Club will not be responsible for articles lost or stolen from the Club area
- F. Hobie Beach:
 - 1) Motorized water craft are not allowed on Hobie beach at any time. This beach is for non- motorized water craft only.
 - 2) All non-motorized crafts must return to assigned parking at night unless the owner is remaining on the beach overnight.
- G. No Fireworks, firearms or archery equipment shall be permitted on Casper Boat Club grounds or docks.
- H. Pets: No dogs, cats, animals or reptiles will be allowed on Casper Boat Club premises at any time except for traveling to and from a member's boat and only then when controlled by a leash. A member shall be responsible for any "mess" so created by his/her pet. All droppings must be picked up, bagged and removed from the Club premises
- I. Vehicles: Maximum speed limits of ten (10) MPH shall apply to all vehicles on Casper Boat Club grounds. Excessive acceleration is prohibited. Only designated Roads shall be used by motorized vehicles including Motor scooters, Motorcycles and golf carts.

HOUSE

- A. Assessments: A minimum charge may be set by the Board of Directors for months of May, June, July and August for purchases in the Clubhouse. **Excluding** the purchase of gas and any other reciprocity agreements the Casper Boat Club has with any other private clubs (e.g. Casper Petroleum Club, Casper Water Ski Club, & Casper Country Club). All purchases must be signed by a member using signature and membership number, with the exception of gas purchases, where gas cards are used.

- B. Billing: In conjunction with ARTICLE IV. Section 3, of the By-Laws, accounts will closed out the last day of the month and statements rendered by the fifth (5) of the following month with payment due by the twentieth (20) of the month. If not paid by the end of the month of the billing, names of the delinquent accounts will be posted and charging privileges withdrawn until payment is made. In conjunction with ARTICLE IV., Section 3, the delinquent member shall be reported to the

Board of Directors. If on the thirtieth (30) of the next month (forty (40) days from the due date) the account is unpaid, the member's account will be turned over to a collection agency. Unavoidable exceptions to the above must be discussed with the Treasurer.

C. Cash Payments: Cash may be accepted for purchases providing the Club receives a cash ticket. If a guest wishes to pay cash a member must sign the ticket which will be turned in to the Treasurer as a cash item.

D. General Rules:

- 1) The stewards and/or Club Manager are vested with the authority to enforce all House rules. Any guest who fails to comply with a proper order or request of the Steward and/or Club Manager shall be required to leave. Any member who fails to comply with a proper order of the Steward and/or Club Manager in connection with the house rules may thereby forfeit their membership.
- 2) The House Committee shall have the authority to make changes in the House rules that it considers necessary. These changes shall be in effect immediately upon notification of the Steward and/or Club Manager, but will be considered temporary until approved by the Board of Directors and posted on the Club Bulletin Board.
- 3) The Club will not assume responsibility for the financial liability of any member, C.O.D. packages or other C.O.D. material, or bills paid for any member or guest. No long distance calls shall be charged to the Casper Boat Club telephone. Local calls shall be limited to five (5) minutes.
- 4) Shirts and shoes are required in the Lounge and Dining Room at all times. Members in wet clothes shall use the service entrance (West Door) for access to the restrooms. Steward Service is provided in designated areas for those not in proper attire for the Clubhouse (wet clothes or bathing suits). After 6:00 p.m. in the dining room, casual dress, reflecting a reasonable standard of grooming and decorum, is required. These standards **exclude**, "short-shorts", "cut-offs" or "bathing attire".
- 5) Club Hours of operation will be determined by the Board of Directors, prior to April 1st (first), and the membership notified of hours of the Club.

E. Liquor:

- 1) The introduction of liquor not purchased at the Casper Boat Club, in the Clubhouse, on the Lower Deck or the front porch is prohibited. The penalty for violation of this rule may be the expulsion of the offending member.
- 2) Unless consent is obtained from the Board of Directors, no beer kegs, full or partial, shall be allowed on Club facilities, including the grounds and dock areas.

RESTRICTIONS

- 1) Without prior approval of the Board of Directors, there shall be no private enterprise, teaching of sports or other endeavors by a member or non-member in the Club area. If permission is granted, the Club shall receive a

percentage of the gross for the use of the facilities. This percentage shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

- 2) No member of the club shall be permitted to send any employee, steward or Manager off the Club premises for any purpose. Written and signed complaints regarding any employee shall be addressed to the House Committee Chairman.
- 3) Conduct unbecoming a gentlemen or lady will be meet with prompt and decisive action.
- 4) No pictures or decorations shall be placed in the Clubhouse except upon the authority of the House Committee.
- 5) Members shall not post notices or other written material on the bulletin board except upon the authority of the House Committee.
- 6) Members shall not take from the Club any articles belonging to the Club.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION FOR INFRACTIONS OF CLUB RULES & RESTRICTIONS

Upon receiving a written, signed complaint addressed to the Board of Directors, the following action will be taken.

- 1) 1st Offense. Secretary sends a warning letter to the offender.
- 2) 2nd Offense. The member must appear before the Board of Directors.
- 3) 3rd Offense. The member's membership will be subject to termination.
