Please review the **Camping Rules and Policies** on the reverse side of the newsletter. All members are reminded to follow the Bylaws and polices set forth by the Board of Directors.

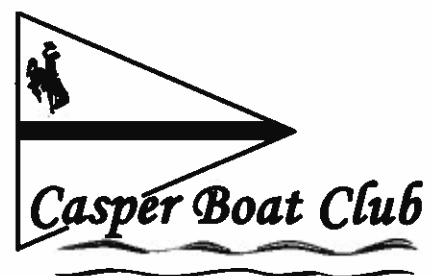
The Poker Run is still on, and we have some great plans for this year. Get ready for another fabulous Poker Run!

CAMPING RULES AND POLICIES CASPER BOAT CLUB

1. Members and Guests using CBC designated campsites are required to sign in and register at the Club House.
2. Only camping vehicles, i.e., motor homes, travel trailers, pop-up trailers, or truck campers (hereinafter "Campers"), may use designated campsites with electrical hookups.
3. **Camping is limited to 7 nights. Campers must remove RVs/campers/tents from premises for a minimum of 24 hours before beginning new camping cycle.**
4. All campsites are first come, first serve. Sites may not be held or reserved in any way.
5. Only on-site members and their on-site sponsored guests may use designated campsites. Members must be on-site with their guest throughout their stay and will be responsible for their guests' behavior.
6. Campers can only make use of the electrical connection provided at the site. No daisy chaining. Fee is \$10 per night.
7. Campers or vehicles may not block roads or other camping spaces.
8. Dogs, cats, or other pets on CBC premises must be controlled by a leash. No pets are allowed on Swim Beach, on Club House Porch/Deck or in Club House. Owners are responsible for keeping dogs from barking and are responsible for cleaning up after his or her pet. All droppings must be picked up, bagged and properly disposed of.
9. If management is unavailable, contact the Grounds and Facilities Committee on CBC website.
10. Casper Boat Club is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged property.
